## WHAT YOU SHOULD LOOK FOR IN A COLLEGE:

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## **MEANINGFUL CURRICULUM:**

Look for programs with social/racial/environmental justice built into their core curriculum, providing a well-rounded educational experience that will also satisfy your altruistic motives.



## **COMMUNITY SERVICE EXPERIENCES:**

If you're interested in personal growth, you should look for colleges that offer opportunities for you to see the world while making a difference. At Saint Rose, students get involved in lowernine.org projects in New Orleans or humanitarian efforts in Guatemala.



#### **SERVICE-LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES:**

Maybe you're a life-long volunteer or maybe you're new to giving back. Look for colleges that make it easy for you to get involved in the community. See if they offer courses that center around community service and count toward your college degree, helping you make the most of your investment.

#### **SPIRITUAL LIFE PRESENCE:**

Colleges with built-up spiritual life programs typically have a mission to give back and help others. Additionally, these programs often invite important speakers to campus that elicit thoughtful conversations and provoke action.



## **OTHER THINGS TO CONSIDER:**

Location: Do you want to stay close to home or go somewhere out of state?Affordability: The Net Price Calculator can estimate how much financial aid you'll receive.Academics: Are there any industries that interest you? Do any majors stand out?Livability: Is the campus the right size? Do you like the surrounding community?

## HOW YOU SHOULD SEARCH FOR A COLLEGE:

Research a college's mission and values: Do they resonate with yours? Could you see yourself living out their founding values and beliefs? This information should be available on the college's website, but also demonstrated on their social media platforms, so make sure to follow their accounts! Participate in a volunteer opportunity: See if you can get involved before you even apply. Each year, Saint Rose celebrates Reach Out Saint Rose Day, where hundreds of community members are welcome to participate in local community service projects. Feel the vibe: Look for colleges that offer the opportunity for you to testdrive the student experience so you can get a feel for the community. At Saint Rose, we have a "Knight for a Day" visit, where students can shadow a student in their major of interest and attend classes.
